The weather was not quite ideal, as there was a slight drizzle and the temperatures were a bit more cool than the season would dictate (OK, it was cold and wet), but in true alumni fashion, we pressed on. However, we did manage to run through our routine a couple of times in the stadium. I must admit, the biggest thrill for me during the entire 2012 Alumni Band season, was the cheer that we received from the crowd when we took the field at the Band Show. It sends a chill down my spine every year. A huge part of that reception came from our very own Tiger Band.

We did our running cadence on-field followed by a jump halt and our fanfare. Randy Fillmore, the voice of the Alumni Band introduced us and after four bass drum beats, we took off downfield playing the first segment of *Tiger Rag*. That was followed by the circle-drill to the song *More* and a conversion that put us into a concert formation.

Prior to the playing of the concert number *What a Wonderful World*, we were able to catch our breaths during the presentation of the Pride Achievement Award. The 2012 recipient was Mister JW himself, John Walk. The JW cadence is one of the more identifiable features of both the Tiger Band and the Alumni Band and we can all thank John for that.

After the concert number, we went through another conversion that set us up for the remainder of *Tiger Rag*, the three count turn around, stomp down, bow and extension. Again, **THE CROWD WENT WILD**. This was followed by the running cadence off field which led us into JW. That's when the adrenaline kicks in. We're exhausted and it really doesn't matter because **IT'S ALL ABOUT BAND!!!**

Following our performance there was a ten minute intermission in order for the crowd to regain their composure. In the second half, we were treated to the Nordonia Lancer marching band, the Massillon Washington Tiger Swing Band, the Green High School Bulldog Band, and the Highland High School marching band.

Next there was the award presentation. The Alumni Band has three awards other than the Pride Achievement Award: the person that travels the farthest in order to participate in the Band Show, the "most senior" marcher, and the best represented class. Courtney Smith (class of 2002) from Naples, Florida, traveled the most miles in order to march with us. Ron Wahl and yours truly (class of 1966) were the oldest guys to march. The class of 1997 had the most marchers; six.

The exclamation point to the evening was The Cuyahoga Falls High School Marching Tiger Band. They were completely and totally awesome. After the Band Show the Tiger Band and the Alumni Band gathered in the cafeteria for the annual pizza party. It's always a pleasure.

In all, we had 92 marchers which was a big improvement over the 76 that participated in 2011. Next year we hope to get well over 100.

On behalf of the Alumni Band members and the committee I want to thank Brandon Duvall, Justin Harris, and the IMP for their hard work preparing for the Band Show and the support that they have given us. I also want to thank the Cuyahoga Falls Board of Education, and the City of Cuyahoga Falls for their continued support.
